SEE PASSAIC COUNTY'S DUTCH ARCHITECTURE

PASSAIC COUNTY HAS A NUMBER OF DUTCH COLONIAL HOMES THAT WOULD MAKE A PERFECT DAY OUT WITH A FRIEND. EACH HOME IS SITUATED NEAR GREAT PLACES TO GRAB A BITE TO EAT! GRAB A FRIEND AND ENJOY THE DAY!

DEY MANSION WASHINGTON'S HEADQUARTES IN WAYNE IS A GEROGIAN REVIVAL WITH DUTCH INFLUENCE FROM C.1770. SPEND YOUR DAY ON THE GROUNDS AND ENJOY THE BEAUTIFUL GARDENS WHICH WERE DESIGNED BY THE OLMSTED BROTHERS. A SHORT WALK FROM THE GARDENS SITS IN THE DRINK BAR AND GRILL, SERVING UP FRESH FOOD AND DELICIOUS DRINKS.

THE VAN RIPER-HOPPER HOUSE, ALSO IN WAYNE, IS A TRADITIONAL DUTCH COLONIAL HOME FROM C. 1786. THE HOME IS ONE AND A HALF STORIES HIGH AND BUILT OF NATIVE FIELDSTONE AND ACCENTED WITH REDSTONE. THE VAN RIPER-HOPPER HOUSE ALSO SERVES AS THE WAYNE MUSEUM. WHILE YOU'RE IN THE AREA, VISIT POSITANO WHERE YOU CAN FEAST ON AN ARRAY OF OFFERINGS FROM THEIR SOUTHERN ITALIAN MENU.

THE VANDERHOEF-WESTERVELT HOUSE, LOCATED IN WEASEL BROOK PARK IN CLIFTON, IS A C.1775 DUTCH STONE HOUSE. THE HOME IS A WELL-PRESERVED EXAMPLE OF LATE-18TH CENTURY DUTCH STONE DWELLING WITH A HIGH LEVEL OF WORKMANSHIP. IT IS AMONG FEWER THAN A DOZEN SURVIVING EXAMPLES OF THIS TYPE OF PROPERTY IN PASSAIC COUNTY. AFTER YOUR VISIT, TAKE A STROLL THROUGH WEASEL BROOK PARK AND HEAD OVER TO SHARKY'S FOR SOME WINGS AND CLAMS.
